

## Update on Current Projects

The group has now met 3 times and is making good progress in planning how we can address the needs of children and young people in the borough who are affected by domestic violence.

### Training

We are putting together a proposal to offer basic domestic violence training to all frontline staff in the borough and hope to have the programme finalised by September this year. Meanwhile check out the training section of this newsletter for details of other courses and events and do contact us with your training needs.

### Education

Providing children and young people with the knowledge and skills to build relationships based on respect, shared power and a commitment to non-violence is key to preventing them becoming involved in abusive relationships in the future. We hope to have a plan in place by October this year to roll out a co-ordinated domestic violence education programme to all schools in the borough.

### Support for families

Various programmes have been piloted across the country that provide a safe space for children to explore their feelings and come to terms with their experiences, as well as supporting the non-abusing parent and helping them to communicate with their children and rebuild relationships. We are researching which of these models might be appropriate to use in Kingston. See the resources section for a number of tools and useful websites.

### Safeguarding Processes

The group is working hard to ensure there are clear information sharing arrangements in place and that safeguarding responses are understood, implemented and effective. We will be producing local protocol and practice guidelines on how to respond to and support children affected by domestic violence later this year.
